For the twelfth year, UC San Diego will be hosting Reach for Tomorrow (RFT), a 7-day Summer Program for Middle School age students from various regions of the country. Past years have seen students from Kotzebue, Alaska, Chicago, IL, East Chicago, IN, Clovis, NM, and Metropolitan Washington, DC. The program prepares middle of the bell curve, underperforming students to meet their academic potential, thereby increasing the size of the qualified applicant pool for post secondary education. Over 55 students will live in campus housing; attend Physics, Neuroscience, Science, Engineering, and Marine Biology labs taught by UC San Diego professors and staff. They will complete evening recreational activities in various varsity sports taught by the coaching staff and students at UC San Diego. They will pilot small planes, become certified in CPR; visit Navy

ships such as the Midway for flight simulation or large aircraft; take sailing, surfing, kayaking, and rock climbing lessons; complete obstacle and leadership reaction courses; and meet with motivational guest speakers each evening. **UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA INSTITUTE ON GLOBAL CONFLICT AND COOPERATION (IGCC)
PUBLIC POLICY AND NUCLEAR THREATS TRAINING PROGRAM (PPNT)**

7/24 – 8/8

The innovative Public Policy and Nuclear Threats fellowship and summer education programs began in 2003 as an intensive training program and academic fellowship for PhD students in the UC system from a diverse set of academic disciplines in the physical and social sciences. The program is designed to deepen the participants' understanding of many of the important issues in U.S. nuclear strategy and policy, supported by an understanding of the scientific foundations of this policy. The fellowship program is funded by a National Science Foundation Integrative Graduate Education, Research and Traineeship (IGERT) grant. The summer course, which enjoys funding support from the National Science Foundation, aims to give participants the knowledge and analytic tools to contribute to the debate on future U.S. nuclear policy through lectures, discussions, and debates on such diverse topics as nuclear weapons design and delivery, US nuclear strategy, international and national nonproliferation strategies, and emerging terrorist and state nuclear threats. This year's summer workshop participants includes PhD students from the University of California system and other leading US universities, university faculty, professionals from government agencies and from the national nuclear laboratories in the U.S. and U.K. Speakers leading sessions at the summer workshop include current and former high-ranking government officials, scientists from US weapons laboratories, officials from the International Atomic Energy Agency, and leading academics.

**UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA INSTITUTE ON GLOBAL CONFLICT AND COOPERATION (IGCC)
PUBLIC POLICY AND BIOLOGICAL THREATS TRAINING PROGRAM (PPBT)**

7/31 – 8/9

In July and August of 2009 the Institute on Global Conflict and Cooperation will host *its sixth* Public Policy and Biological Threats (PPBT) training workshop. This two-week training program on biological threats, biological terrorism, and biodefense *trains* current UC Ph.D. students, postdocs, and junior faculty, along with industry and government professionals from the U.S. and abroad. Social science and health science faculty from throughout the UC system will lead the biological threats program alongside national policy leaders and scientists.
